AN impressive field of senior and junior runners tackled the Stoop Fell Race held on a cool, sunny day at Penistone Hill County Park on Sunday.

British, English and Yorkshire fell running champion Natalie White, who runs for Bingley Harriers, was the guest celebrity starter.

After starting the various junior races, which had a record 112 entries, 24-year-old "Nats" won the The Stoop ladies section of the senior race for the third time.

She set a new record of 37.06, shaving over a minute off her previous best.

The massive field of 323 runners included 67 ladies. Second among the ladies was Jo Buckley, who lives on Harden Moor. Buckley also finished second in the Withins Skyline Fell Race held at the end of October.

The 2000 Stoop winner, Lisa Lacon, was only 23 seconds behind Buckley.

Race organiser David Woodhead said: "Lisa, a fourth dan black belt in karate, used her strength through the bogs to overtake guest runners Blue Haywood of Lincolnshire and Mel Hyder, the England U-14 fell running champion."

Thirty-two-year-old Rob Hope, of Pudsey and Bramley Athletics Club, won the race for the fifth time, having won in 2001, 2002, 2003 and 2004.

He defeated last year's winner Andi Jones of Salford and ten-time winner Ian Holmes of Keighley to claim the title in very wet conditions underfoot.

Jones was no match for Hope on the descent from the Old Haworth Boundary Standing Stone at Oxenhope Stoop.

Holmes repeated his V-40 win of last year and has never finished outside the top three positions. And incredibly he has only missed one Stoop race through illness.



In the junior section, congratulations must go to Lily McGuinness who beat all the boys to win the U-8s race outright and set a new girls record.

Bo Haywood improved the Girls U-10s record by 31 seconds while Bingley's James Hall equalled the Boys U-10s record.

Covered in mud, the juniors enjoyed the goody bags and pop with the added bonus that Natalie White had signed a individual photo for each and every one of them.
