Glover 'chuffed' with Splash win

FORMER England junior Helen Glover, 22, made a major step forward by being first lady in the 24th Soreen Stanbury Splash on Sunday.

The race was run in gale force winds which ripped the door off organiser Dave Woodhead's car and bowled over the portable toilets despite them being fastened down.

At one stage in the junior race the youngsters were running almost horizontal to the ground such was the force of the wind.

Keighley's Helen Glover was 'well chuffed' with her surprise win. The doctor's receptionist in Skipton last year finished second in the BOFRA fell championships and was fourth in the Auld Lang Syne Race. With this latest result the 2007 season looks promising for her.

On the day Helen could not put a foot wrong. She also won the prize for first local lady and also took one of the Screen Cycle tops signed by Olympic rider Chris Hoy and donated by race sponsors Soreen.

The winner of the other signed shirt was Welshman Paul Oldfield.

The race was for the 13th time by the Master of the Moor Ian Holmes. The 41 year-old Bingley Harrier won despite having raced in the Northern Cross-Country Championships the previous day.

The first local man was top cyclist Robin Bradbury of Aire Valley Cycles who won the trophy for the fourth time in 12th place overall having the edge on six times winner Colin Moses
