Stoop run

RECORDS were broken as over 200 runners raced over frozen ground in last weekend's Stoop Race from the Penistone Country Park at Haworth.

lan Holmes swept to victory in the senior race to continue his domination of the event — with his eighth consecutive win. The race has been run over the last nine years and the only person to

beat him was Boss Whalley, who won the first running with Holmes taking second place.

"lan has decided he is going to continue winning the race as long as he can," said organiser Dave Woodhead.

Holmes was just outside his own record time, despite reporting that conditions were good with frozen ground leading to fast times.

"He was very quick on the way up to the top of the Stoop, but then he had to thread his way through over 200 runners making their way up. He went through the ice a couple of times and took two heavy falls which took their toll," Dave Woodhead said.

He completed the course in 27 minutes 43 seconds and was chased home by Mark Horrocks of Clayton-le-Moors Harriers who was just over a minute behind.

However older runners set new records with Ken Taylor setting a new mark for Over-50 runners with a time of 32mins 17secs.

Tracey Ambler, a housewife from Ilkley, enjoyed the run of her life to win the women's event and set a new over-35 women's time of 35mins 19secs. Lisa Lacon of Holmefirth was second woman and Wendy Barnes of Barnsley was third.

Under-9's runner Penny Addison enjoyed a superb run in 17th place ahead of Tom Addison (Under-12) and Jenny Addison (U9) in a family battle with Jos and Rory Addison getting an early taste of competition running.

Mark Smith won the Under-16 race ahead of Sam Hounslow (K&C) with Anna Jagan (EPOC) in fourth place.
